Air Traffic Controllers and ASRS – A 33 Year Partnership

Air Traffic Controller reporting to ASRS has been critically important to aviation safety since the program's inception in 1976. We note that with the introduction of FAA Notice N JO 7210.707, not only are Controllers rights under ASRS restored, but ATSAP reports will be provided to ASRS.

ASRS produces and distributes high quality safety information, from the front ranks of professional aviation personnel to decision makers in government and industry.

Electronic Report Submission (ERS): ASRS has developed a new feature which enables you to securely send an Aviation Safety report via the internet. All ASRS Reporting Forms (General, Air Traffic Control, Maintenance, and Cabin) can be sent electronically.

ASRS Database Online: Users have the capability to search and retrieve specific information from the ASRS database. The ASRS database includes the narratives submitted by reporters (de-identified). These narratives provide an exceptionally rich source of information for human factors research, education, training, and more.

CALLBACK: ASRS's monthly safety bulletin is relevant to pilots, air traffic controllers, and others. Each issue of *CALLBACK* includes excerpts from ASRS incident reports. In addition, *CALLBACK* may contain summaries of ASRS research studies and related aviation safety information.

ASAP Participation – ASRS, in addition to direct reporting, currently receives information from 104 ASAP programs, either through paper reports or secure electronic transmission.
